

Sports Premium Impact Report 2021-22

Sports Premium is allocated to schools based on the number of pupils on roll in Years 1 to 6 recorded in the January Census.

Southgate School received two instalments: £6854 in October 2021 and £9666 in April 2022 to use across the academic year to make additional and sustained improvements to the quality of PE and sport on offer and to facilitate pupils being active during break times. An outline of our sports premium spending is in the table below: £16,520 total.

This year, 6 pupils also took part in Southgate School's first cycling expedition — a 3 day residential consisting of a number of road and trail routes.

This will feed into our plan for spending in 2022-23.

Across 2021-22, Dance was introduced as a new enrichment option for pupils and those that attended the sessions had specifically chosen the activity. This meant that pupil engagement was high. Pupil's fed back that they would like to build up to a performance for their class/whole school. This will be developed in the next academic year.

From our premium of £16,520, we have spent £15.726.47 this year allowing a carry over of £793.00 to put towards our outdoor resources.

Plan for Sports Premium Spending 2022-23:

This year, Southgate School will receive a total of £16496 to allocate to the area of Sports Premium. In October 2022 we have received £6883 with the next instalment in April 2023 totalling £9613.

Over the course of the year, Key Stage 2 pupils will again have access to swimming lessons at Kirklees Leisure Centre. Additional staff will be implemented, where appropriate to ensure that all pupils are able to access these lessons in a safe and meaningful way. We are also in discussions with Kirklees Active Leisure to look at increasing the number of pupils across school who are able to meet the following National Curriculum KS2 requirements for swimming:

• Swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25m.

- Use a range of strokes effectively, for example, front crawl, back stroke and breast stroke.
- Perform a safe, self rescue in different water based situations.

Our whole school enrichment offer will be further developed to allow pupils across school a wider choice of engaging, physical activities. All pupils in Years 9-11 will continue to make a choice of activity as well as regular feedback from pupils on new activities they would like to access. Pennine Sports Partnership will continue to have a significant role in our school enrichment offer, with a particular focus in 2022-23 on the continued development of new and less experienced teachers. Other external providers were are looking to collaborate with include Huddersfield Giants Rugby Club as well as reestablishing our links with Huddersfield Town. The wider choice of activities will continue to promote pupils' engagement, increase the number of pupils across school engaging in physical activity and receive positive pupil voice.

We will continue to focus on the development of staff practice in P.E through regular audits and teacher feedback. New or less confident teaching staff will receive strategic support from Pennine Sports Partnership to develop confidence and skillset when teaching PE. This will ensure that all pupils receive a thorough, well balanced P.E offer, allowing them to develop a wider range of skills and further promote engagement in lessons.

With the recent introduction of the teaching scheme "Get set 4 P.E" a thorough audit of resources will take place in the Autumn term which will inform us of specific resources that should be purchased in order for the scheme to be delivered accurately and effectively.

Finally, in 2022-23 we aim for our pupils to engage in accessible sporting competitions within the local community. Funding will be put in place for this to be staffed appropriately and resources such as transport put in place.
