

Sports Premium Impact Report 2023-24

+ Sports Premium Strategy 2024-25

Sports Premium is allocated to schools based on the number of pupils on roll in Years 1 to 6 recorded in the January Census.

Southgate School received two instalments £6875 in October and £9625 in April to use across the academic year to make additional and sustained improvements to the quality of PE and sport on offer and to facilitate pupils being active during break times. An outline of our sports premium spending is in the table below: £16,500 total.

Enrichment opportunities have increased to 16 options in total. Woodland classes accessed a bespoke provision. Across 2023-24, Dance was available as an enrichment option for pupils and the majority of pupils were allocated to this that would benefit and engage. Key benefits of the sessions included increased co-ordination, developing confidence and opportunity to work together with peers.

For pupils to access small group cycling sessions off-site, in the local community and on local roads where appropriate. For pupils to increase confidence on a bike and show progression in their cycling skills. For pupils to develop skills in general bike maintenance and bike safety. 	This year, we have continued to deliver our cycling enrichment. In total, 76 pupils were able to access cycling enrichment. 52 Pupils learnt to ride a 2 wheel bike. 25 pupils learnt to ride either a 3 wheeler bike or a balance bike. 2 pupils learnt to cycle on the local roads. 12 pupils learnt to cycle on local trails. 6 pupils were able to develop their bike maintenance skills. 5 pupils completed a 3 day cycling expedition on the Tissington Trail in The Peak District this year. This residential consisted of a number of road and trail routes.
£150	Shooting starts Dance – October 23	 To further develop the Dance enrichment programme. 	An increasing number of pupils were able to access Dance. Key benefits of the sessions included increased co- ordination, developing confidence and opportunity to work together with peers.
£512.25	Resources	 To purchase additional resources to support the get set for PE scheme. To support the ongoing replenishment of PE resources. 	Resources were purchased to support the Get Set for PE programme which was launched last year. Resources were also purchased for the ongoing development of PE. This included indoor footballs, indoor rugby balls rugby tags, basketballs and soft balls. Pupils have been able to access PE with up to date and relevant resources, this has promoted a high level of engagement.
