

English and Communication

My Communication: In My Communication this half-term, we will be continuing to look at My brother is a superhero. We will be looking specifically into how we communicate with a wider audience of people, and if the way we interact with different groups are different or the same.

Reading: To develop our reading skills this half-term we will be supporting our pupils in reading their own library books for enjoyment, as well as working towards reading a range of texts.

Writing: Pupils will be looking at different elements of spelling and grammar, to ensure that their sentences are communicating what they are intending.



Creative Thinking

This half term, students will be exploring the theme "Trailblazers" through Art and Design Technology. They will learn about artists and animators who have been pioneers in their field and will use this inspiration to create their very own flipbook animation.



My Computing/ Using Technology

Computing – In computing, pupils will create their own animations linked to their own short story or a book that inspires them.

Online Safety – In Online safety, we will continue to look at online safety with the use of AI and chat GPT. Pupils will explore how it can spread fake news.



Identity and Wellbeing

PSHE – In PSHE we will be looking at how we can keep healthy and what is needed to live a healthy life. The topics will cover. Body image, Healthy choices, Emotional and mental health with links to what we can do to improve this.

SRE – In SRE, we will be focusing on puberty and changes linked to physical and emotional. Pupils will also look at consent in a relationship and links to consent.



Maths and Problem Solving

This half-term we are again focusing on the four operations but with a focus on addition and subtraction which will then allow some pupils to move onto division and multiplication.

To develop functional skills, we will be looking at using the four operations to support questions around real-life situations such as measuring or dealing with money.

To develop our use of Shape, Space and Measure, we will be looking at time and fractions with links to post-16 qualifications.

My Health/Healthy Lifestyles

PE – We will be developing pupils' understanding of what it is like to compete in activities such as shot put, Javelin, long jump, sprinting etc and measure out distances or times. Pupils will practice these skills through looking at effective feedback.

Food Tech – In Food Tech, pupils will be exploring foods from other cultures, religions and beliefs. We will celebrate diversity whilst developing our cutting skills and knowledge on kitchen health and safety.

Science: Our focus will be linked to electricity and how to make an electrical circuit.


History: Our History focus will be linked to medicine through time with links to key people who discovered these.
